# Carers UK National Carers Summit 2011

Carers UK have announced this year's National Carers Summit date. It is to be held on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 10am to 4pm, at Clifford Chance, Canary Wharf, London.

In previous years the summit has seen a variety of Government Ministers and Politicians face a multiple of questions from an audience of carers.

The event is for carers and former carers, you don't need to be a member of Carers UK however priority is usually given to their members as this event is usually oversubscribed.

### Fundraising and Donations.

DPfC relies on fundraising and donations to continue activities for carers. Have you got any good ideas to help us raise funds?

### How can you help us?

We run an **Amnesty Box** all year round where people can donate unwanted gifts or bad buys. These gifts are used as raffle prizes to raise funds for outings etc

### Borrow a bed!

We have three collapsible beds that we can loan out to carers free of charge. A small deposit is required.

### **Blue Badge Reforms**

Major reforms to the Blue Badge Scheme disabled parking system, which helps 2.5 million disabled people, are being implemented. The measures, which started to come into force from April, include:

- Providing local authorities with an on-the -spot power to recover badges that have been cancelled and misused
- Shared administration between authorities including an online application facility - resulting in faster renewals, reduced abuse and operational efficiency savings of up £20 million a year.
- Wider use of independent mobility assessments to determine eligibility.
- Extending the scheme to more disabled children under three and severely disabled Armed Forces personnel and veterans; and removing residency requirements for disabled service personnel and their families who are posted overseas on UK bases.

The maximum cost of the badges goes up from £2 to £10.

On Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup> July DPfC lost a dear friend Frank Lowndes

He first came to DPfC when we were based at the Lansdowne Centre for support in his caring role for his wife Jeanette in the mid nineties. He soon became an active member of the Doncaster Carers Forum campaigning for more recognition for carers. He also volunteered at the Carers Coffee Mornings which were held at the centre and when we moved in 2007 to our present base in Bessacarr, Frank came with us taking on the role of volunteer gardener and odd job man as well as continuing with his role at Coffee Mornings.

Frank was an invaluable member of the volunteer team and would support staff by attending information events with them; he loved interacting with the public, and will be dearly missed at these events. He was very passionate about carers getting the support they needed both whilst they were caring and when there caring role came to an end. After his wife Jeanette died, he became a member of the Carers Strategy Group representing former carers; he also became active in other areas such as the Doncaster 50+ group and the DMBC Reading Panel.

Frank was a warm, generous, kind person and everyone at DPFC will miss him.

### **Directions by Car**

from the St Ledger (racecourse) roundabout exit onto Bawtry Rd (A638). Stay on Bawtry Rd (A638) until you pass the Punches Hotel, at these traffic light turn left into Church Lane. When you come to a staggered junction, continue ahead on Church Lane, we are on the right.

#### **Bus Route**

Catch the bus (brown line) from stand A5, get of at the Water Tower Lane bus stop. Church Lane is the road opposite the water tower and we are on the right
