Info Bus

DPFC staff offered advice and information on the bus on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday along with other carers strategy member organisations. We had six new contacts with carers who have now received advice, information and support from DPFC.

It was felt that the bus was a good way of interacting with the public and a good tool to engage 'hidden' carers.

Carers Against Poverty

22nd April 09

In April we took a bus with 24 carers on board to London to take part in the first national petition and protest about the need for financial recognition for carers.



The protest was organised by a group of carers with the support of Carers UK and local carers centres such as ourselves. We met other groups of carers from all over England and Wales in Trafalgar Square and then marched down to 10 Downing St where our group certainly made themselves heard above everyone else.

DPFC had arranged for carers from Doncaster to meet local MPs Rosie Winterton, Ed Miliband and Caroline Flint at the Houses of Parliament after the petition

Meeting with Leigh Lewis Permanent Secretary at Dept of Works and Pensions

11th May 09 - London

DPFC offices were contacted at the end of April by Carers UK to see if we could arrange for some carers to attend a meeting in London with Leigh Lewis, Permanent Secretary at DWP, Terry Moran Pension, Disability and Carers Service, Jeremy Groombridge, Director Jobcentre Plus and representatives from Carers UK.

The meeting had been arranged to inform the scrutinizing of the National Audit Office report into carers' benefits and Leigh felt it would be beneficial to hear first hand carers experiences with the intent to improve services to carers.

All the carers were given a chance to talk about their experiences and raise concerns regarding the barriers faced when accessing the above services whilst in a caring role.

The meeting was felt to be productive by the carers and they left with a promise from Leigh Lewis to invite them back in 6 to 9 months time to discuss any future changes in

had been handed in. So we headed down to meet them after the petition was given to the carers chosen to go to number 10. We nearly didn't get past the entrance gates due to our T.shirts which had the slogan 'Carers Against Poverty' written across the front of them (we were told this was seen as lobbying and was not allowed). One or two carers did think about taking them off in full view of the press but in the end we were shown to a private room to turn them inside out!



All the MPs seemed very interested in what we had to say and promised to follow up on information given to them by individual carers. We headed home after what many on the bus expressed as a 'great experience and 'we all want to do it again next year' -so, watch this space!

By Car

From the St Leger (racecourse) roundabout exit onto Bawtry Road (A638). Stay on Bawtry Road (A638) until you pass the Punches Hotel at these traffic lights turn left into Church Lane. When you come to the staggered junction, continue ahead on Church Lane, we are on the right.
